

TUC Mobility Consortium Overview

The National Mobility Consortium comprised of the three big Cretan Institutions ([Technical University of Crete](#) as applicant and coordinator, [University of Crete](#) and [Hellenic Mediterranean University](#) along with [Chania Chamber of Commerce and Industry](#), **aims to correspond to the continuously increasing students demand towards wishing to undertake a traineeship within the framework of the Erasmus+ program.**

On this basis, this regional Consortium is seeking to resolve problems related to Crete's geographical position, the southern-most and largest island in Greece. As unity is strength, it is expected all the partners involved will address common challenges, endorse employability of young graduates, promote research, innovation and student development and well-being while ensuring greater coherence between activities in the area of education and training. Participants will have the opportunity to receive a sound and thorough preparation and guidance, to improve language skills, and learn how to be effective in heterogeneous and multi-cultural environments.
