He had been awarded with the European Research Programme Marie Sklodowska Curie and worked as a postdoctoral research fellow at the Institut Catala d'Arqueologia Classica in Tarragona, Spain, (2019-2022). Since 2024 he has been teaching Prehistoric Archaeology at the University of Crete. He has conducted fieldwork in Greece and Spain, which included both excavations and intensive surveys. He has been a member of the European Association of Archaeologists and a Honorary Researcher at the Institut Catala d'Arqueologia Classica in Tarragona, Spain. His main research Interest are: Minoan, Mycenaean, Early Bronze, Neolithic Archaeology, Landscape Archaeology, Prehistoric Pottery, Burials and Religion.
